While the recent agreement from the European Union to extend Brexit day as far as October 2019 is welcome in helping to avoid an economically damaging 'no deal' Brexit, it

Through our Europe Direct Information Centre (EDIC) North Highlands & Islands contract, the Chamber has been working hard to support businesses and individuals in the region through this turbulent time. 
